CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The welfare of the child is paramount

All children, without exception, have the right to protection from abuse

1. Policy

No member of the trustees, helpers or other volunteers will have unsupervised access to children unless appropriately vetted

Procedure

All members of the trustees, helpers or other volunteers will be made aware of this policy and the relevant vetting procedures. Should checks become necessary, they will be undertaken in compliance with the Protection of Children Act 1999, the Children Act 1989 and Part V of the Police Act 1997

2. Policy

All suspicions or allegations of abuse against a child will be taken seriously and dealt with speedily and appropriately

Procedure

The Hirer will be responsible for Child Protection Matters. They will have responsibility for reporting concerns that arise, as a matter of urgency, to both the Bassingham Village Hall Committee and the local authority Child Protection lead agency

3. Policy

All trustees and volunteers will be required to become aware of Child Protection issues

Procedure

All members of the trustees, helpers or other volunteers will be advised on how to access copies of the relevant Acts and DOH guidelines. Relevant Child Protection training for trustees will be encouraged

4. Policy

The policies and procedures will be regularly reviewed

Procedure

An annual review will take place in February each year to allow for any required up-date of policies and or procedures. New trustees and volunteers will be provided with an understanding of their responsibilities in matters of child protection

5. Policy

Members of the local community who use the facilities provided by the Group should be aware of the Child Protection policies as adopted by the Group

Procedure
